**Birthday/ date of Celebration:** 8<sup>th</sup> day of the fifth month of the lunar calendar marks the birthday of Wen Shi, a woman from Yue Cheng, a town near the Xi River in the province of Guangdong.

**Legend:**

According to legend, Wen Shi was an old woman who made her living by fishing. One day she found a giant egg which hatched five unusual creatures.
